What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Pie Chairman's Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Pie Funds Management Limited (**Pie Funds**) prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Pie Chairman's Fund seeks to provide investors with long term growth by accessing the higher potential growth of predominantly smaller companies. It does this by investing predominantly in other Pie Funds Products.

The Fund may also invest in cash and directly in Smaller Companies.

How has the fund performed?

The S&P Global SmallCap Total Return Index represents the lowest 15% of float-adjusted market cap stocks in each developed and emerging country. Investors may also be charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds, although these are not currently charged by Pie Funds).

Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Lucy had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Lucy received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$136 (thats 1.36% of her initial \$10,000). Lucy did not pay any other charges. This gives Lucy a total return after tax of \$52 for the year.

What does the fund invest in?

This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.2





^{*} Australasian equities and international equities arise from investments in Australasian and International managed funds. These funds are actively managed and hold varying levels of cash over time. This can be seen, on a look-through basis, in the Top 10 Investments list below.

Hedging: We actively manage all currency exposure. It is not our intention to 100% hedge the currency at all times; some overseas securities may be unhedged. The hedged foreign currency exposure (as a percentage of total foreign currency exposure of the fund) is 57.94% (unhedged 42.06%).
