What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Pie Australasian Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Pie Funds Management Limited (**Pie Funds**) prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Pie Australasian Growth Fund seeks to provide investors with capital growth by investing predominantly in a concentrated portfolio of hand-picked listed Australasian Smaller Companies, where Pie Funds considers value is greatest and the opportunity of earnings growth is high. The Pie Australasian Growth Fund may also invest in other types of financial products such as cash, unlisted equities and companies that are not Smaller Companies.


How has the fund performed?

What fees are investors charged?

Investors may also be charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds, although these are not currently charged by Pie Funds).

Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Lucy had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Lucy incurred a gain after fund charges were deducted of \$2,212 (that is 22.12% of her initial \$10,000). Lucy did not pay any other charges. This gives Lucy a total gain after tax of \$2,083 for the year.

What does the fund invest in?

This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.²



Hedging: We actively manage all currency exposure. It is not our intention to 100% hedge the currency at all times; some overseas securities may be unhedged. The hedged foreign currency exposure (as a percentage of total foreign currency exposure of the fund) is 65.81% (unhedged 34.19%).
