FUND COMMENTARY

The Global Growth 2 Fund returned 6.3% during the month, bringing it to a 12-month return of 4.5%.

The resilience and corresponding strength of global markets surprised investors (positively for a change) during the month of May, with all major indices posting solid gains. Notably, a host of positive earnings announcements from the tech sector and a quietening down of the global tariff war were the main catalysts. And whilst volatility was still high, it was much lower and generally calmer than the chaos of April 2025.

The fund performed well during the month, outperforming in most sectors, with our overweight industrials and underweight financials delivering the most significant outperformance. Digging deeper, it was our tactical overweight airlines position which delivered the most return within the industrials sector.

Stocks of note this month were Celestica which delivered at 25% return and Eli Lilly which fell 18%.

Celestica reported earnings last month and has continued to outperform as sell side analysts continue to raise the target price associated with this company.

Eli Lilly fell on earnings at the start of the month and continued to retrace with most of the healthcare sector. This sector has been the worst performer in global equity markets in May, largely due to the Trump administration's "most favoured nations" policy which is seeking to reduce Medicare costs.

Meanwhile, despite a cut to the OCR in New Zealand, global long term interest rates crept higher - meaning investors can't completely relax just yet. However, we remain optimistically cautious that, with the US administration now focusing on growth and meaningful "deals," the worst of the tariff volatility could be in the rearview mirror.

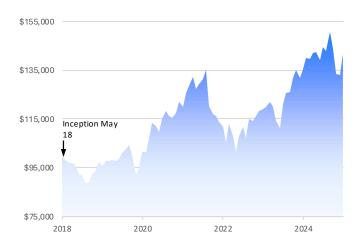

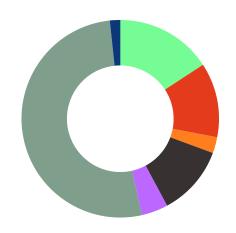
