What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the JUNO Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you compare the fund with other funds. Pie Funds Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Growth Fund seeks to maximise capital growth for members, over 10 years or more. The Fund invests primarily in international and Australasian equities with a focus on globally-known brands, along with a cash and fixed interest exposure.

How has the fund performed?

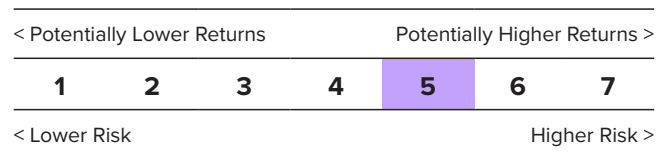

The market index is a composite index (10% S&P NZX Investment Grade Corporate Bond Total Return Index (NZD)/65% MSCI ACWI IMI Net Total Return Index (NZD)/5% NZBond Bank Bill Index/5% Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Total Return Index Hedged (NZD)/15% S&P/ASX All Ordinaries Total Return Index (NZD)). The market index changed during the quarter to reflect changes to the target asset allocations in the updated SIPO. In particular the MSCI ACWI IMI Net Total Return Index (NZD) decreased from 80% to 65% and the S&P/ASX All Ordinaries Total Return Index (NZD) was included at 15%.

What are the risks of investing?

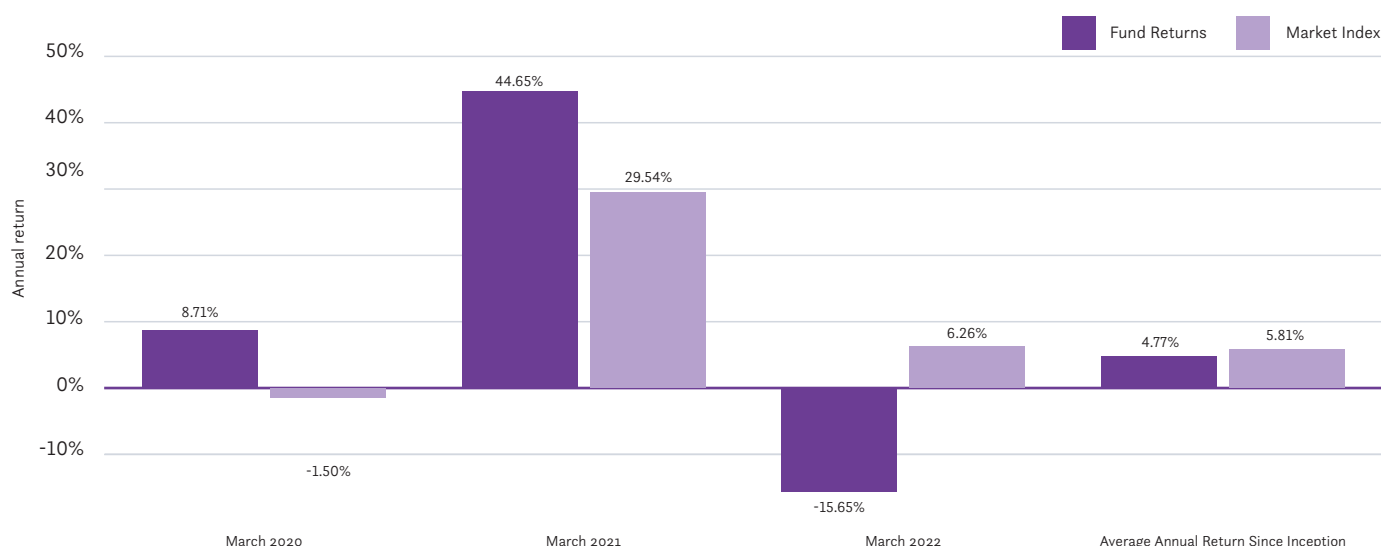

Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

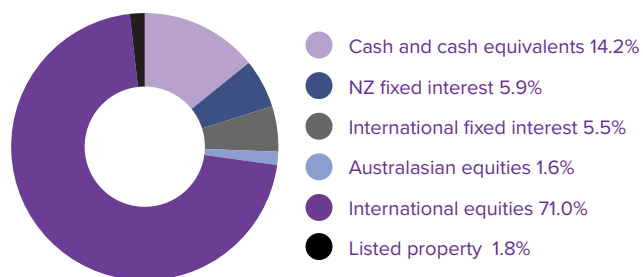
Emma had \$35,000* in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Emma incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$9,270, (that is -26.49%** of her initial \$35,000). Emma did not pay any other charges. This gives Emma a total loss after tax of \$9,505 for the year.

*This figure has been used as it represents close to the average contributing KiwiSaver Scheme member's balance in 2021 (FMA News and Resources, 4 October 2021).

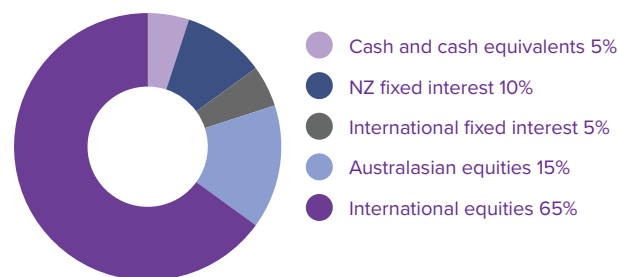
**This is the percentage return after deducting the total fund flat fee of \$240 p.a. Fee based on fund balance of \$35,000.

Hedging: We actively manage all currency exposure. It is not our intention to 100% hedge the currency at all times; some overseas securities may be unhedged. The hedged foreign currency exposure (as a percentage of the total foreign currency exposure in the fund) is 60.07% (unhedged 39.93%).
