PIE FUNDS MANAGEMENT SCHEME: PIE CASH PLUS FUND

This fund update was first made publicly available on 31.10.16

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how Pie Cash Plus Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Pie Funds Management Limited (Pie Funds) prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Cash Plus Fund will seek to provide investors with a return which outperforms the official cash rate (OCR). The Fund's strategy is to invest predominantly (approximately 80%) with New Zealand registered banks (the intention being with at least two such banks) in cash held on call or term deposit for a duration of no more than 12 months. In addition, the Pie Cash Plus Fund may also invest (approximately 20%) in equities either directly or through the other Pie Funds products. We may also invest in bonds and other types of financial products at our discretion).

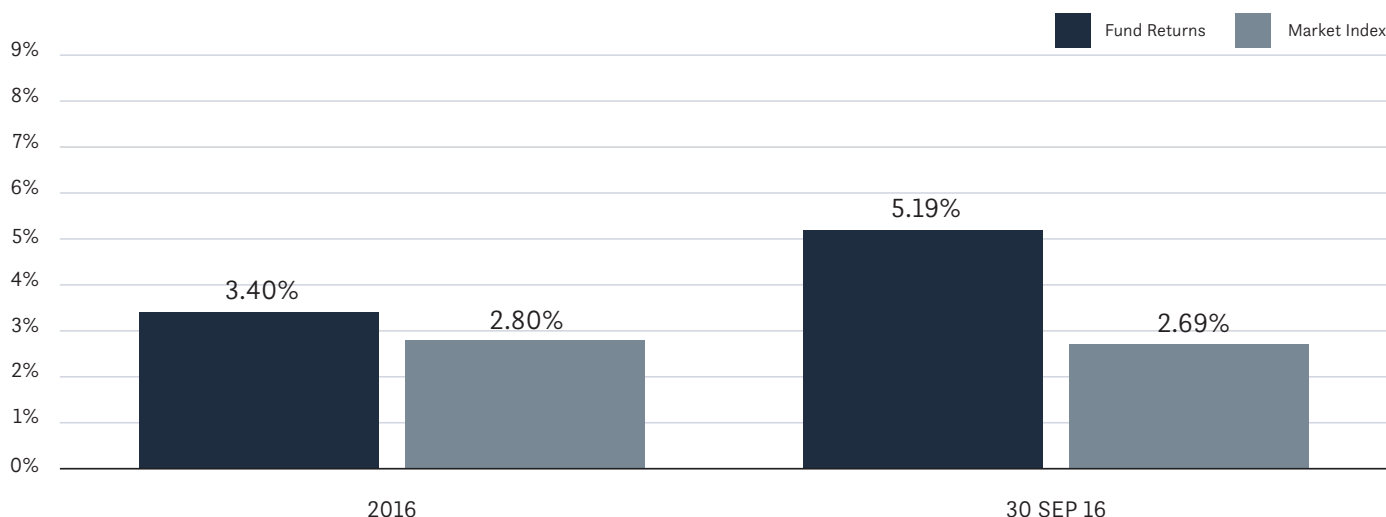

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Lucy had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Lucy received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$766 (that is 7.66% of her initial \$10,000). Lucy did not pay any other charges. This gives Lucy a total return after tax of \$692 for the year.
